Coordination with Community Partners

GCA's Career Advisor coordinates with all Community Partners to provide the GCA's students with Mental Health and Physical Health services. Through this coordination, the Career Advisor coordinates the use of the Student-Services Wing in order to directly connect Community Partners to GCA's students within our building. Impact

Through the use of the SWSF & DPIA funds, Glass City Academy hopes to expand the services to students in the areas of Mental and Physical Health, to increase access to community partnerships, increase professional development for staff members, and expand before and after school meal services to students. Directly, the entire population of GCA (approximately 360 students) will benefit from the funding, by having direct access to community partners within the building. All students will also benefit from the access to food, both before and after the school day. Indirectly, students will benefit from a healthier climate within the building, and a healthier body and mind. The amount of students using the services of the community partnerships will be monitored, in order to determine the effectiveness of the funding. Student attendance will also be monitored in an effort to see if mental and physical healthiness results in better school attendance.
